## 2. PRODUCT SUBJECT

### Subjected goods:

- Mineral products
- Products of the chemical or allied industries
- Plastics, rubber and articles
- Raw hides and skins, leather, fur skins and articles
- Pulp of Wood or of other fibrous cellulosic material
- Diagnostic reagents
- Textiles and textile articles
- Articles of stone, plasters, cement, asbestos, mica...
- Natural or cultured pearls, precious or semi-precious stones...
- Base metals and articles of base metal
- Machinery and mechanical appliances, electrical equipment; Parts thereof...
- Non-exempted vehicles, Aircraft, vessels and associated transport equipment
- Optical, photographic, cinematographic, measuring... instruments and apparatus
- Miscellaneous manufactured articles
- Vehicles, vehicle spare parts

<b>Exempted goods (*):</b>	<p>Second-hand (used) goods classified under prohibited goods.</p> <p>Products regulated by the Ghana FDA, such as food products, cosmetics and pharmaceutical products.</p> <p>However, applications for these products may be processed on a voluntary basis.</p>
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### 3. Technical Requirement

<b>Conformity requirements:</b>	<p>Compliance of goods to applicable standards, in the order of priority specified below*, and taking into account any national deviations, shall be demonstrated through testing and/or conformity documents issued by accredited entities.</p> <p>Applicable standards, in order of priority: Ghanaian Standards, followed by International Standards, then European and National Standards, and finally Manufacturer Specifications where no applicable Ghanaian, International, European, or National Standards exist.</p>
<b>Labelling requirements:</b>	<p>Markings and instructions required under the applicable standards shall be provided in at least the English language.</p>

Application office(s):	Ghana Standards Authority offices

#### 5. Control testing requirements

Applicable cases:	Conformity document not available or not acceptable
Laboratory criteria:	ISO 17025 accredited laboratory Under conditions: manufacturer's in-house laboratories, other third party laboratories.
Testing:	Control testing according to the essential requirements of the applicable standards

#### 6. Physical inspection requirements

Scope of inspection:	Review of markings as per applicable standard(s) and identification of products
Destination inspection:	Not allowed
Witness of loading:	When required
Seal of container:	When required
Sampling:	In case of control testing (see section 5 as above)
Type of report issued:	Inspection report (IR)

#### 7. Facilitation Procedure Fees

Route B - Registration: USD 400 per annum (first 15 product/line items)

Route B-Each additional product/line item above 15: USD 25 per item per annum

Route C - Annual Factory Assessment: USD 1,200 per factory per year
